

## INFORMATION YOU MAY NEED WHEN FILING FOR INSURANCE REIMBURSEMENT

1. Women's International Pharmacy strives to maintain affordable pricing for insured and non-insured customers.
2. Check your insurance plan for coverage parameters. Please be aware that few insurance companies cover compounded medications.
3. Medicare Part D does not routinely reimburse for compounded prescriptions. If you have a supplemental plan you will want to check with your provider for coverage of compounded prescriptions.
4. If your insurance company does cover compounded medications, follow the instructions for claim submissions outlined by your insurance company.
5. Enclosed with your prescription are two forms you should include with your insurance claim submission: **the Prescription Information Sheet** and **Invoice**.
6. Make a copy of the claim information and submit as directed by your coverage plan.

## INFORMATION YOU MAY NEED WHEN HANDLING A REJECTED CLAIM

- Confirm coverage parameters with your insurance administrator.
- Compounded drugs are legally recognized by all states as prescription drugs. Compounded drugs do not have and are not required to have FDA approval. Practitioners may prescribe them, pharmacists may compound them.
- National Drug Code (NDC) numbers are part of an identification system designed for manufactured pharmaceuticals and not chemicals or compounded items. Compounded medications **do not have** NDC numbers. The individual active ingredient(s) in the compound **may** or **may not** have an NDC number. We provide NDC number information for manufactured drugs and ingredients when available.
